- In five years, Extreme Makeover: Home Edition has built 99 homes, 1 dance studio, 2 little league fields, 2 free clinics, 1 firehouse, 1 church, 3 community centers, 1 duplex for two homeless families, 1 volunteer camp cabin and 1 media center
